Legion has a +13 day heading date vs Nui* at 0 days. In Agricom's portfolio, **Legion** is intermediate between Three⁶⁰ at +20 days and Reason at +3.

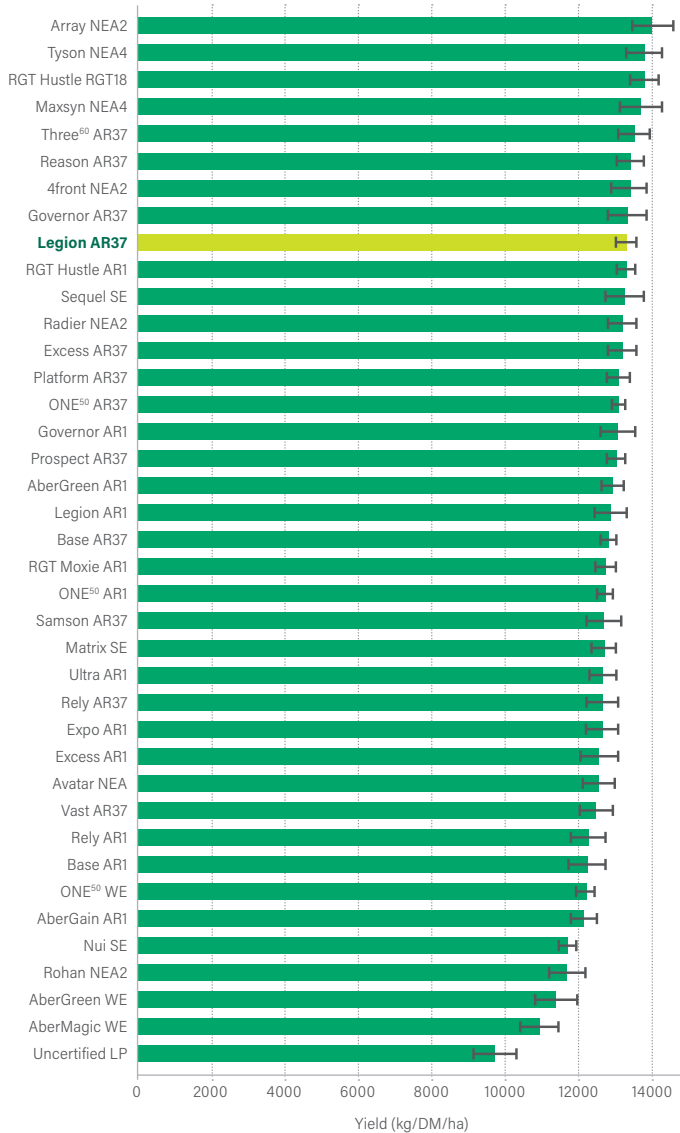

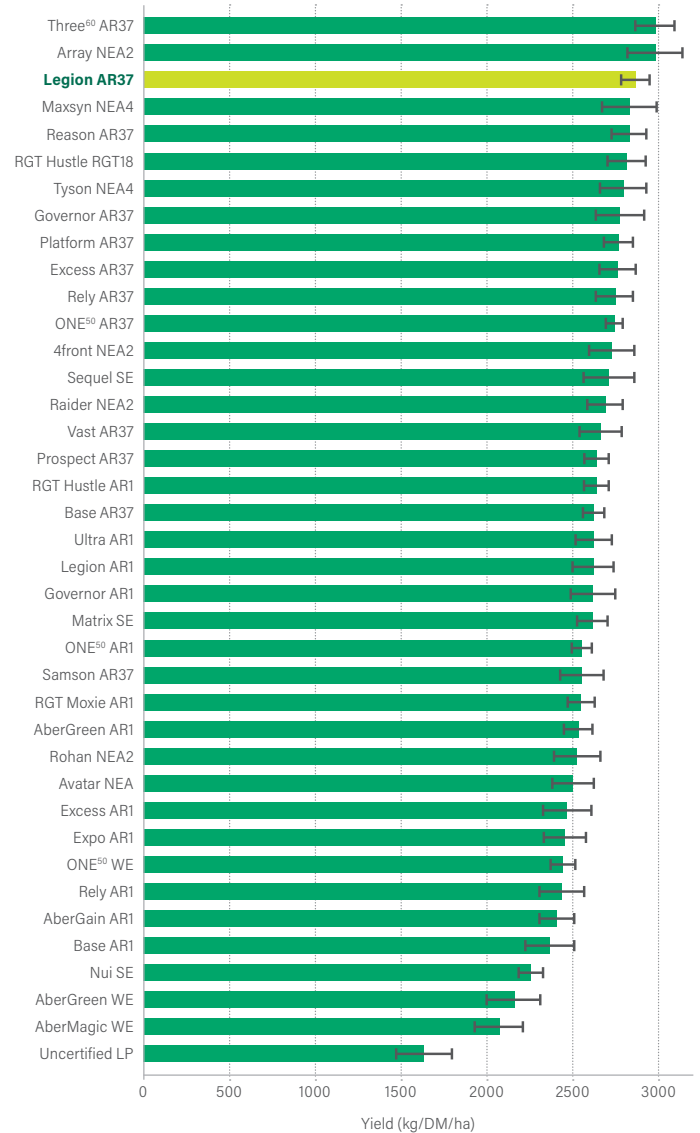

Autumn Yield



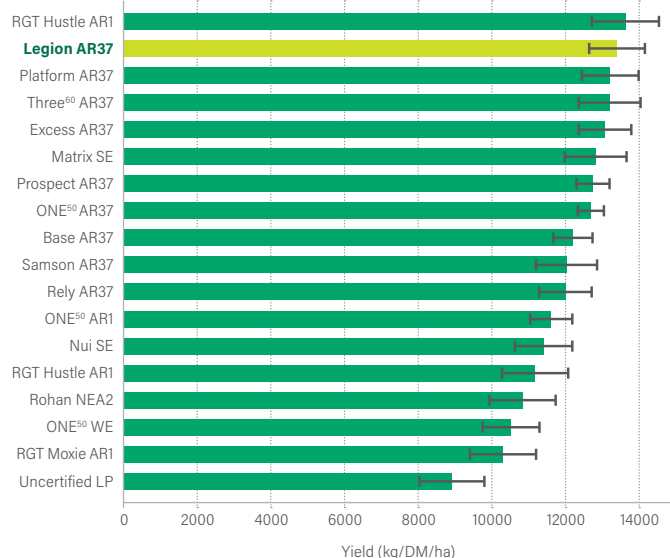
Performance summary

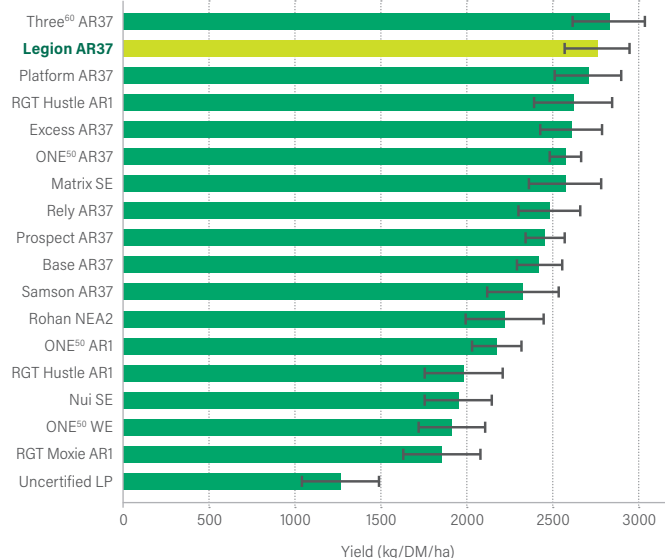

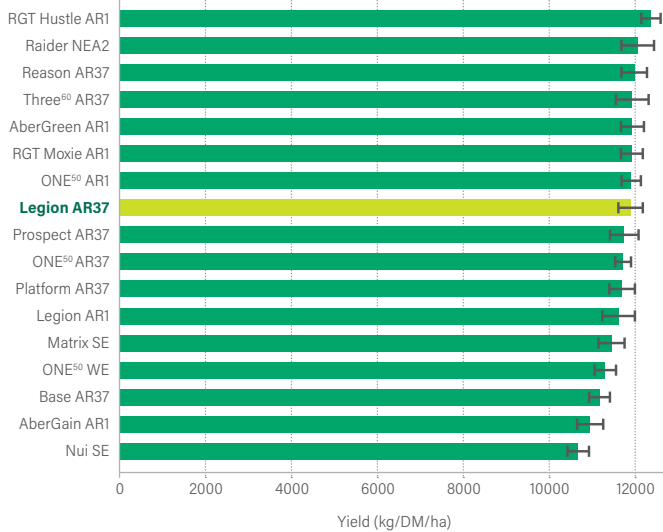


Autumn Yield

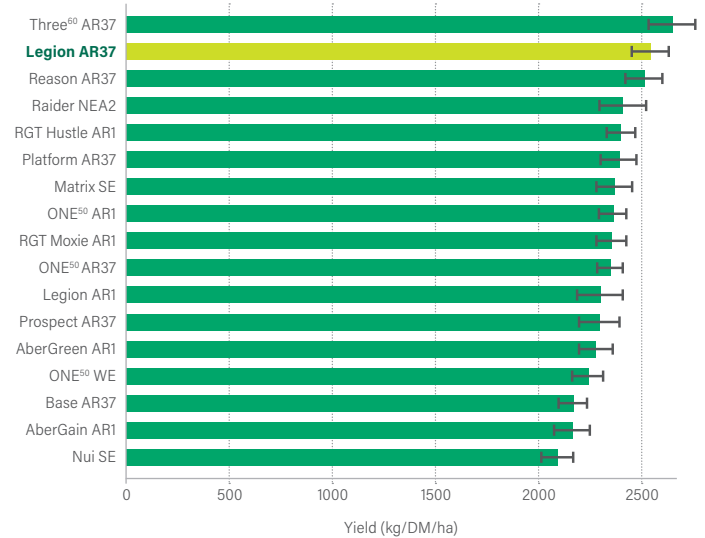


NFVT Perennial Ryegrass | Lower North Island | 2024-2025

Total Yield

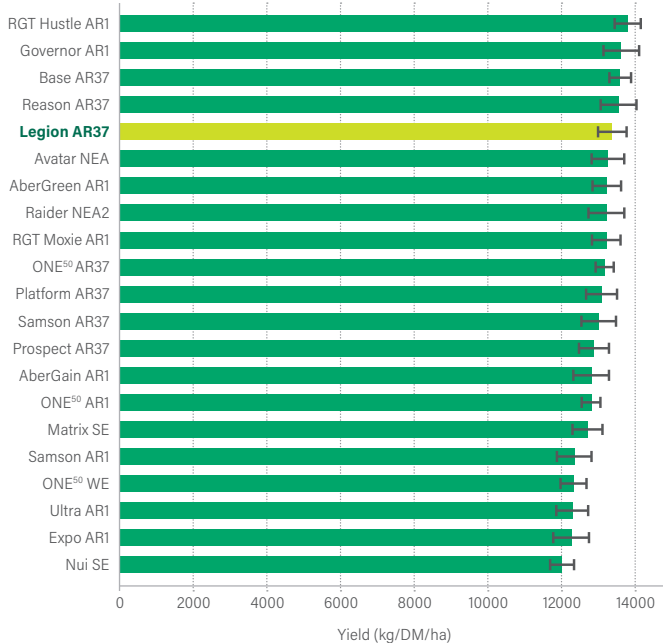


Autumn Yield

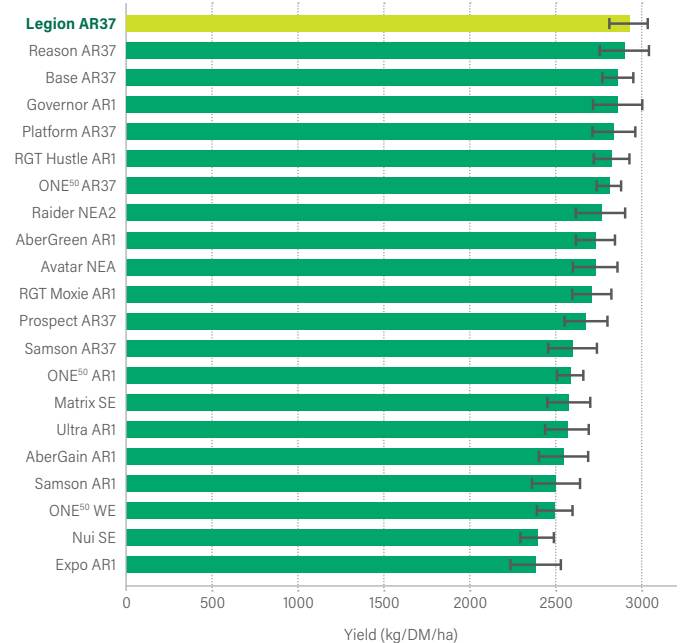

Legion can be used in general sheep and beef pastures and has excellent density for periods of set stocking and winter grazing. It has a good spring growth habit while maintaining low aftermath seeding in summer, helping with pasture quality through summer into autumn for mating.
