

“For hard sheep grazing”

- Small to medium-leaved white clover
- Bred for increased stolon recovery after dry summers
- Persistent clover under hard grazing
- Recommended to be included in all dryland mixes

Background

Nomad is a small to medium-leaved white clover particularly suited to New Zealand’s drier regions and as a base component for white clover blends.

Nomad was bred by AgResearch Grasslands utilising summer-dry easy coast hill country ecotypes selected from old pastures from Gisborne to Canterbury.

Nomad was selected for drought tolerance by having strong autumn stolon recovery after a dry summer. **Nomad** has resistance to pepper spot, leaf rust and sclerotinia. **Nomad** also has a high seed yield, for natural reseeding.
